MRCB Building System was shortlisted from nearly 450 applications spanning 25 industries and 27 countries. The MRCB Building System is a modular construction method where the majority of a building's construction takes place off-site in a fabrication facility and is subsequently installed on-site.

This approach enhances construction speed, consistency, safety, and the overall quality. It also reduces waste that goes to landfills, significantly cuts down greenhouse gas emissions, and is aligned with the 5 UN Sustainable Development Goals.

The SL25 Awards, now in its fourth year, is an independent annual accolade jointly curated by the Stewardship Asia Centre (SAC), the INSEAD Hoffmann Global Institute for Business and Society, Willis Towers Watson, and The Straits Times.

SAC is a Singapore-based non-profit organisation established by Temasek Holdings under Temasek Trust to advance stewardship across Asia. Guided by Temasek's ethos to "do well, do right and do good," Stewardship Asia Centre champions leadership that integrates the needs of stakeholders, society, future generations, and the environment.

The award recognises 25 international projects every year that showcase steward leadership excellence, where projects are part of an organisation's core strategy and strive to have a significant positive effect on stakeholders, society, future generations, or the environment.

The SL25 initiative has garnered increasing prominence with submissions from organisations across 27 countries, underscoring its significance and influence in advancing steward leadership excellence in the region.

MRCB's recognition among this distinguished group reinforces its position as a leader in sustainable urban development, with the MRCB Building System forming a critical part of its strategy to deliver environmentally responsible and future-forward infrastructure across Malaysia and beyond.
